

## A Short Guide to Sharing Your Work: Developing a Shareable Guide for Publishing OERS

## Affordability & Accessibility

- Consider the barriers to student access, such as adding a price to your OER.
- Consider print options for students without reliable WiFi off campus. 8% don't have broadband at all.
- Be sure your OER works with screen readers for those with visual impairments.
- Publishing in multiple formats will give your students more options.

## **Format Types**

- **Epub** is flexible, and easy to adapt. An eReader is needed to read these.
- Epub3 is friendly for non-Roman characters and languages that read up/down or right to left.
- PDF for Print makes it easy for students to print out an OER at minimal cost.
- PDF for Digital Distribution is useful for those without WiFi at home.
